

Noted from recently examined deeds re Worle

An abstract begins ^{6/7} "Sept 1765" when the trustees of the will of Jas^s Bishop, yeoman late of Worle, are named as Mary Bishop, James Bishop, Joel Bishop, and Tho^s Mellins.

It points out that their Mortgagee, in this case, is John Pigott of Brockley. They are about ~~the~~ "to devise" the Manor of Worle, with messuages & (etc) belonging, to Arthur Peters of Bristol a grocer & his wife Martha.

This deed deals with "lot 28" described as "the close on the west side of Alliers Moor Common" having some intermixed lands - total about 5 acres AND the small close adjacent "late Edward May's One Acre" - all these situated in Worle and Hewstake."

NOTE. All further ref^s refer to that piece as AbhIEPS with no "H."

Arthur Peters died intestate, there is a confusing ref^{ce} that his will was PCC Probate 20 Sept 1751 (?) then a ref^{ce} that the "other full undivided moiety of the Manor Hewish and Peanes" passes to Mrs Martha Peters.

20/11/18

1765 Sept 15th Robert Peters a baker of "Bristol St Paul & Jacob", only brother of Arthur and the heir, releases the piece to Martha

1777 Aug 21 Will of Martha Peters leaving her estate in equal division to her brothers Gregory and Richard Ash.
(Will probated, no detail)

1783 Feb 14 Will of Gregory Ash of Bristol, gent devised his 1/2 to his nephews Edward Ash son of Richard. This estate is in occupation of Joel Bishop Grace Davis Henry Weeks Edmund Moss Dani Bishop & Elizth Bishop
("Proved PCC 23 July 1792")

1791 Jan 12 Will of Richard Ash, distiller, now of Shurehampton - to his wife for life thence his son Edward Ash
("Proved PCC 19 March 1785")

1816 March 6 Will of Edward Ash, gent of Bristol St James. The 'rent & residue' in Trust, to auction, to his wife Elizabeth and to
Thomas Bonville, son in law
Gregory Ash, son but he died before his father. x
Richard Ash, son Probated
John ~~Shaw~~ Thirybeck, friend. linen draper of Bristol. (Renounced 1818)

Edward died 13 May 1818 Will Probate PCC 23 Sept 1818
