Indenture 28/29 Sept 1490 Between Dame Francis Peyton of Stagbeck (als Hagbeck) Hall in NFK widow, with Sir Th Rons of Henham Hall SFK and Th Heigham of Hunstanton Esq SFK To Gregory Ash Esq and wife Hester Ash of Bristol. Slets of stuff there after payment of £108 to the 3 as trustees of Sir Henry Peyton's Will All that annual fee farm rent of £4. 10 from "the Manor of Worle als Worle" as part of a fee farm rent of £15 from the Manors of Worle, Bromptonbury, and Norton Sub. *

In 11 Nov 22 Charles II (~~1666~~) There was an "Act for advancing the sale of Fee Farm Rents"

* In 22 Ch II the combined rents were granted to Francis, Lord Hawley, Sir Charles Harbord, Sir W^m Howard, Sir Th Talbot, Sir Rob^t Stewart, and W^m Harbord (their heirs etc) in trust for sale "and which sum of £4. 10 p a there was beyond the memory of man the only property payable" *next ref*
